



## Recent Trenton Water Works Updates and Ongoing Efforts



At the time of this e-mail newsletter, recent media reports have indicated that the State of New Jersey's Department of Community Affairs will **allow the City of Trenton to proceed with the use of a private company to assist in the management and operations of Trenton Water Works.**

Mayor Kelly Yaede and her administration continue to monitor this latest development, as well as continue to have contact with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, which regulates water quality issues for Trenton Water Works.

Within the past two weeks, **Mayor Yaede called for the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to hold a meeting with local leaders on the ongoing issues with Trenton Water.**
