# Recycling: Ecological Facility

- Managed shared services contracts with West Windsor Township, Robbinsville Township, Mercer County DOT & I, Mercer County Parks Commission, Chesterfield Township, and the Borough of Fieldsboro to process their Class B and C material.
- Recorded monthly and yearly recycling tonnage figures from residential, Township work crews, and commercial drop offs at the facility.



# Recycling: Ecological Facility (cont.)

- Filed yearly Class 'B' and 'C' reports in accordance with NJAC 7:26 and 7:26A regulations with the NJDEP.
- Monitor Class 'A', 'B', and 'C' activities at the facility according to NJDEP rules and regulations.
- Collected at the facility:
  - Light Metal: 186.57 tons
  - Cardboard: 180.04 tons
  - Oil: 44.53 tons
  - Single Stream Items: 578.82 tons
  - Batteries: 6.93 tons
  - Electronics: 181.68 tons



# Recycling: Tonnage Grant

- Awarded a grant from the NJDEP for 2017 tonnage totals (\$150,719.25).
- Held two Shredding Events with 1,384 residents partaking in the service, resulting in 21.84 tons of paper collected.
- Filed the Township's 2018 tonnage report with the NJDEP.
- Single Stream Recycling Curbside Program: 6,625.60 tons collected.

- Filed the Township's annual report with NJCC that resulted in the township being awarded a \$197,511.76 grant.

# New Jersey Clean Communities: Summer Help Program



- Project areas cleaned:
  - Streets: 42
  - Islands: 36
  - Parks: 3
  - Public parking lots: 2
  - Public buildings: 11
  - Bridges: 2
  - Flower beds: 6
    - Litter and debris picked up: 7.00 tons
  - Performed other various litter abatement assignments as needed

- Days worked: 16
- Miles covered: 33.43

- Litter and Debris collected: 3.15 tons
- Inmate Hours: 225

# New Jersey Clean Communities: Neighborhood and Volunteer Group Clean-up



- 3 Neighborhood Cleanups were conducted as per the Township's contract with Central Jersey Waste.
- Local Boy Scouts held their annual Veterans Park camp-out and clean-up, a two day event.
- An additional clean-up was conducted by the Environmental Commission in and around various streams throughout town.
- The Bromley Civic Center held their annual neighborhood clean-up.
- 17 educational shows were performed by Bill Kerwood at local elementary schools; which educates students on litter abatement, recycling, and clean water. Mr. Kerwood received positive feedback from school administrators and teachers for his approach to educating and interacting with the students. He was very well received!
