Rooted in Catholic Tradition, CYO provides services in an inclusive, non-discriminatory manner, respecting the culture and faith of all. Initiated in 1952 primarily to provide recreational activities for Catholic youth, CYO was formally incorporated in 1961, and has evolved into a full service childcare, youth development program provider, and social service agency.

The CYO has over 69 years experience in childcare and youth programs and serves almost 1,200 children daily during the school year and more than 1,300 daily during the summer! The CYO also serves approximately 1,200 children (ages 8-14), from Catholic schools and parishes, in seasonal athletic leagues. The CYO is led by a dynamic volunteer Board of Trustees which includes professional and community members with experience in diverse areas. The CYO currently has 40 full-time, 90 part-time and 100+ seasonal employees. Volunteers play vital roles at CYO, from sports coaches to students acting as aides in our childcare programs, to corporate groups who help us maintain and beautify our facilities and grounds.

# 2021 CYO HIGHLIGHTS



- For the first half of the year, the CYO was still offering remote learning programs for our school age students whose parents did not have the flexibility to work at home. Our Ewing and Yardville Pre-Schools did in person programming while our two Trenton Pre-Schools followed the Trenton School District schedule by providing virtual learning opportunities.
- The CYO re-opened four of our Summer Camps in 2021 with reduced capacities and several safety protocols/procedures in place. The popular American Red Cross swim lessons also returned this Summer.
- The grand opening of the CYO Yardville Pool House took place on June 15<sup>th</sup> with Bishop David M. O'Connell blessing this beautiful new facility. A ribbon cutting with Hamilton Mayor Jeff Martin and members of the CYO Board of Trustees was enjoyed by a crowd of 50 friends and supporters. Former camper and Counselor, Mitchell Hennessey (one of the leading donors for this project) spoke about the impact the CYO Camp made on him.
- The Hamilton Township School District approved a contract extension for the CYO to manage the Before/ After School programs at Greenwood, Lalor, Klockner and Wilson Schools through June 2024.
- Several of the CYO sports programs re-opened. The players were thrilled to return to action for the first time since March 2020.
- The CYO continued their partnership with the Trenton YMCA to offer 350 grab and go lunches every weekday in front of our CYO South Broad Street Center. This program ran up until Labor Day weekend.
- Grants totaling nearly \$100,000 were received from the N.J. Department of Children and Families to assist the CYO in purchasing PPE, adding extra staff needed to meet the health /safety guidelines and enhancing our technology among other things.
- CYO East State Street and South Broad Street Centers were selected by Comcast to be two of their designated "Lift Zones"! This was a program offered in certain cities across the country to help underserved communities with internet access. Since we had so many remote learners in our Centers, this expanded bandwidth from the Lift Zone allowed our students to complete their work without any interruptions.
- The Bromley Center operated by the CYO through a contract with Hamilton Township continued to serve hundreds of people through the Food Pantry. This critically important service was greatly assisted by several funding partners including: Acme, FEMA, NJ Office of Faith Based Initiatives, St. Vincent de Paul Parish (Yardville), and WaWa. The Robbinsville - Hamilton Rotary Club (President Joe Bellina) has become a fantastic new partner contributing food items on a regular basis.
- CYO renewed our lease with Ewing Township through 2026 with options to extend it as well. And the Township also continued with their Public Donor Agreement which allows the CYO to leverage State funds to provide subsidized childcare to lower income Ewing residents. Ewing Township has been an outstanding partner since 2008 when the CYO began offering programs at the Hollowbrook Community Center.






**REVENUE**

**Food Pantry**

1. The distribution of no cost State & Federally funded and privately donated non-perishable & frozen food to needy, income-eligible families in the Township of Hamilton is provided through this program. Hamilton Township’s Department of Public Works provides monthly assistance for the food drop-off from the Southern Regional Food Distribution Center in Vineland, N.J. to both the CYO Bromley Neighborhood Center & the J.O.Wilson Neighborhood Service Center. John Kilcoyne, a dedicated CYO volunteer, is a huge help with the monthly food deliveries and donated foods, sorting and organizing the foods.

We distribute monthly food packages to an average of **80-90** families per month.

A total of **188** families are registered for the food pantry, as compared to **198** last year. Due to the continued effects of the pandemic and related job losses, the demand for assistance from the food pantry has remained very high although the numbers are lower than 2020.

Distribution days and hours for the Food Pantry are: **Tuesdays & Thursdays & the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month 9:30 - 11:30 am & 2:30-3:30 pm.** (If needed, residents can make an appointment to pick up food in the evenings 6:30-8:30 pm from Tom Valyo of the Teen Center). Emergency distribution is made for individuals who may live outside of our area if a referral is made through a social service agency.

The Southern Regional Distribution Center, in Vineland, NJ, is our primary source of food for our food pantry. Additionally, we receive food and monetary donations from local schools, churches, civic organizations and individuals including:

**2. Teen Center**

Our Teen Center, which opened in the summer of 2005, continues with 9 to 13 yr. old “pre-teens” & 14-17 yr. old teens, who utilize the center’s video games, with the Xbox, PS3, Xbox One & PS4 consoles. We also have a pool table, ping pong table, foosball table, basketball shoot game & air hockey table, along with various board games. Our average daily attendance is **25--30 teens**. Additionally a yoga and mindfulness class provided by Sheltered Yoga.

The Teen Center is designed to provide local youths with educational, recreational and social activities & has become a “safe haven” for Bromley neighborhood youth.

**3. Computer Room Access/Computer Classes**

Hamilton residents have access to our computer room from 9:00 am until 3:15 pm. The computer room contains 16 computers, a networked printer and continues to be available for both adults and students. Uses include job searches, on-line applications, career searches, e-mail checks, researching school projects or business topics and word processing. The usage numbers are an average, as many residents make multiple visits.

**4. Copy, Fax & Notary Service/Job Postings**

Residents continue to use our copier and faxing services free of charge. In addition they are able to get documents notarized at no cost, and view our current list of local job openings

**5. Gateway Head Start**

The Center continues to maintain and support the Head Start program which consists of two classrooms with **19**--3 & 4 yr. old children. The program uses our kitchen facilities for daily breakfast and lunches. They also use the rear playground and social hall for meetings.

Gateway also continues to utilize the social hall and computer room for staff in-service training, local and regional meetings and learning activities. The Gateway Head Start rental payments are made directly to Hamilton Township. The Center also hosted Greenwood Elementary School's Summer Enrichment while the school was under construction as to not have the students learn remotely.

**6. Mentoring Program**

Toshua Turner & Sonia Williams have continued with the girls mentoring program called R.O.Y.A.L. Mentoring. (**R**eaching **O**ut to our **Y**oung **A**Amazing **L**adies). They have weekly Wednesday night meetings in our computer room (during teen center hours) with **25-30** teen girls in weekly attendance. They do crafts and other projects and the program continues to grow. The objective of this program is to help mold young girls into mature, inspired, successful young women. Their group volunteered during our Halloween parade, Thanksgiving Food Giveaway and also our annual Children's Christmas present distribution. The CYO has provided financial assistance toward enhancing this mentoring program.

**7. Health Services**

The Center was host to three COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics and a Flu clinic for Hamilton residents.

**8. Social Hall Usage**

We have rentals all year round on Saturdays. There were a total of **12** rentals/hall usages in **2021**. Most rentals are baby showers & birthday parties, although we also have had bridal showers, wedding receptions, special meeting and community events. Public work employees cover the events & are paid through the rental fee. Special public service meetings are held by Hamilton Fire Co. & Ladies Auxiliary, Mercer County Fire Company Ladies Auxiliary, Dapper Bus Company safety meeting and Gateway Head Start. The Tabernade Chosen Generation Church rents for church service every Sunday from 9am to 12pm.

**9. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Tribute**

The annual tribute to Dr. King was modified this year due to COVID 19 and held at the Bromley Center on January 13. Only the three scholarship winners and their parents attended along with Mayor Martin to have their scholarship checks presented.

**10. Annual Easter Party**

The Easter Party was held on Saturday, March 27<sup>th</sup> at the Bromley Center. **80** area children stopped by for candy, prizes, and an Easter Basket.

**11. Spring Food Festival**

The CYO provided a Spring Food Festival to all Food Pantry Clients on Tuesday, April 13 in partnership with United Way of Greater Mercer County. The festival included a free lunch from a food truck, additional monthly food bag, and a \$25 store gift card. **75** Food Pantry members attended!

**12. CYO Bromley Neighborhood Clean-Up/Earth Day**

On Saturday, April 17<sup>th</sup>, the CYO Bromley Center held the 9<sup>th</sup> annual "Bromley Clean-up/Earth Day". With the help of volunteers, community residents & the Hamilton Twp. Public Works Dept, the following areas were cleaned: the 1700 Block of East State St., Adella, Victor, Rosalia Aves, and Bromley & Farmingdale Parks. Dumpsters were made available by Hamilton Township and many residents were able to clean out their yards and basements. Park benches and tables were painted as well.

**13. CYO/Bromley Summer Camp**

Summer Camp ran for **8 weeks** from June 21st to August 13<sup>th</sup>. A total of **30** campers attended (5 to 9 years old). Daily activities included Arts and Crafts, music, outside play, sprinkler days, and more. Special camp events included a Talent Show, Yoga and Hip Hop dancing.

**14. Summer Free Lunch Program**

The Center was again a feeding site for the Summer Food Service Program through the N.J. Department of Agriculture. Mercer Street Friends was our sponsor for this program. Lunch was provided for **30** children from the Bromley neighborhood, Monday – Friday for 39 days. Karson Foods was the vendor that provided the meals. Mercer Street Friends provided weekend food packs for the children on Fridays.

**15. Farm To Family Program**

For 16 weeks(from July 8 to October 21), the CYO Bromley Center partnered with RWJ Barnabas and Snipes Farm to distribute fresh fruits and vegetables to 25 families and also provided healthy eating and drinking education. The program also addressed food insecurity at a very needed time.

**16. Back to School Cookout**

On Saturday, August 28th, local resident “Big Rob” of Bromley Brothers & Sisters held their annual “Back to School Cookout” at the Bromley Park serving hamburgers, hot dogs and other refreshments to over 200 local residents. They also distributed back packs to needy area children. We supported this event by purchasing hamburgers, hot dogs, rolls and drinks.

**17. Fall Food Festival**

The CYO, in partnership with New Jersey Office of Faith Based Initiatives had a Fall Food Festival for all Food Pantry clients on Tuesday, November 9. The festival included free lunch from a food truck, an additional monthly box of food, and a food store gift card. 75 Food Pantry Clients attended!

**18. Halloween Parade and Party**

The 9<sup>th</sup> annual CYO Halloween parade and party was held on October 29<sup>th</sup>. **50** local children walked the parade route and then came back to the Center for grab and go candy and pizza.

**19. “Giving Back to the Community – Thanksgiving Food Giveaway”**

Our 19<sup>th</sup> annual Thanksgiving Food Giveaway distributed food to over 90 people and was held on Tuesday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> from 9:30am-2:30 pm. We were able to feed local men, women, and children. This event continues to be one of our largest yearly events. With **90** turkeys, gift cards, and food baskets distributed to Food Pantry clients! This event was sponsored by DiPaola Turkey Farm, the Hamilton Senior Center, Crockett Middle School and Nottingham High School.

20. “Giving Back to the Community – Children’s Christmas Celebration”

Our 19<sup>th</sup> annual Children’s Christmas Celebration was held on Wednesday, December 15<sup>th</sup>, 4:30 – 6:30 pm at the Bromley Center for grab and go presents and food. 




