



In 2011, Hamilton partnered with the Rutgers Cooperative Extension (RCE) Water Resources Program to evaluate watershed & stormwater management issues & develop recommendations for improving & protecting community water resources. Goals include: Engaging the community in water resource protection, Managing water quality, Minimizing localized flooding, Implementing Phase II stormwater controls & Improving stormwater facility maintenance. 



The Course of a Revolution:

MAPPING THE TEN CRUCIAL DAYS

DECEMBER 25, 1776 – JANUARY 3, 1777

Fun Fact: Mercerville, known as Sandtown in colonial times, played an important role in the Ten Crucial Days of the Revolutionary War. **General Washington and his troops marched through parts of our town en route from Trenton to Princeton.**

Normally, the Automatic Withdrawal will be taken After the 1st of the Month, but Before the Late Fee Date.






THE WINTER MARCH THAT MADE HISTORY



Fun Fact: In 1914, 12 obelisks were erected marking the 12-mile route General George Washington and his troops marched from Trenton to Princeton beginning on the night of **January 2nd through January 3rd, 1777**. Six of the obelisks can be found within Hamilton Township. The most popular in town is found in the middle of Quakerbridge Road next to a large oak tree, a living monument to this time where lore has it the General himself rested under this tree during the march.



JOHN ABBOTT II HOUSE — BUILT C. 1730

Fun Fact: In November of 1776, as British troops advanced upon Trenton, state treasurer Samuel Tucker fled with the money in his care & brought it to the home of John Abbott II. His location was betrayed and a detachment of approximately 500 British troops descended upon the home where they located Tucker's trunk with his personal items alongside £1500 in unsigned paper money. However, the rest of the money had been hidden by the Abbott family in the bottom of tubs in the home's cellar, covered with broken dishes & various household utensils. Despite close inspection by the soldiers the money was kept out of British hands.







NEW CROSSWICKS CREEK BRIDGE IS OPEN TO PUBLIC

Without the least ceremony or demonstration whatever, the new iron bridge crossing Crosswicks creek, between North Crosswicks and Crosswicks proper, was opened to the public yesterday. The opening was attended only by an employee of the Burlington county board of freeholders and at the time there was no one present to make the first trip over.

Crosswicks creek is the dividing line between this and Burlington counties and both municipalities had to bear the expense. It is the third bridge to be built at or near this spot. The first one was built somewhere in the neighborhood of 1738 and was used by the Hessians just previous to the Battle of Trenton, when they were making great efforts to hold off General Washington in this neighborhood. It lasted until 1833, when it was replaced by an old style lattice truss bridge, which was built without a nail being driven into it. In 1836 there was a sidewalk placed to the structure, but this contained nails. This bridge stood the blasts of seventy-five winters and has been sold. It will be removed within a few months.

The new bridge is of the latest style iron structure, the construction of which was not only not thought of in the days of the building of the one it replaces, but if any one at the time should have suggested it, the possibility of the same would have been doubted.

It was constructed by Newton A. K. Bugbee, about sixty feet distant from the old one and for the purpose of straightening the curve in the turnpike. The approaches to this bridge on both sides of the creek will be macadamized by both counties, so that the conditions there will be improved greatly.

Fun Fact: While the Ten Crucial Days put Hamilton on the map with regards to the Revolutionary War, the banks of the Crosswicks Creek witnessed actual fighting. During the British movement across New Jersey in June 1778 that led to the Battle of Monmouth, American and British forces clashed along the Crosswicks Creek. While the main skirmish was at the Crosswicks Creek border of Hamilton and Crosswicks, a second smaller skirmish occurred as part of a diversionary movement by the British at the Issac Pearson drawbridge located on the Pearson property. Designed to pull the Continental Army away from better defensive ground at Crosswicks, the diversion failed and the local militia and Continental soldiers remained for the larger fight at Crosswicks. It is noteworthy, however, that historians believe the Pearson House served as offices for the Continental Army during the skirmishes.

Fun Fact: Hamilton is home to numerous taverns that were built in the 1700's, many of which continue to operate today. 



Fun Fact: Isaac Pearson, born August 3, 1739, was a prominent individual in the area during his life having held a number of political offices and was even mentioned in Benjamin Franklin's autobiography as a friend with whom he met during the time Franklin's press printed money for the colony of New Jersey. An early active supporter in the call for independence, after a series of defeats at the hands of the British it is believed Pearson agreed to sign an oath of allegiance to Britain in order to save his family. However, he never signed the oath as he was murdered first. Was it the result of a robbery or for not supporting the patriots' cause? Historians continue to debate this question today.



If These Grounds Could Whisper, They Would Speak of the Struggle for Independence

Fun Fact: Within the borders of Hamilton Township, countless Revolutionary soldiers are buried.

Within a cemetery in the heart of Hamilton Square is the final resting place of Rev. Gershom Loveless, a Private in the New Jersey Continental Line, who according to family tradition participated in the Boston Tea Party in 1773.

ECHOES OF THE 18TH CENTURY


Fun Fact: Hamilton is home to a number of houses built in the 18th Century with a rich history that has continued through the centuries while also showcasing the architectural style of the time.

Abbott-DeCou Mansion built 1797



Beck Homestead built 1769

This includes the **Burholme House**, built circa 1700, which would go on to serve as a stop on the Underground Railroad, and the **Beck Homestead** built in 1769 in Yardville, which notably was initially made up of 212 acres purchased for \$12.50 an acre.

The Abbott DeCou Mansion, built in 1797 by Samuel Abbott, has an interesting architectural element: Samuel and his wife, Lucy's initials, as well as the year the home was built, appear on the header bricks on the side of the home.
