



Notice of Vegetation Management Work on PSE&G Electric Transmission Easement

Dear Property Owner,

Public Service Electric and Gas Company (PSE&G) utilizes the electric transmission rights-of-way located on your property. The electric transmission lines on these rights-of-way are essential for PSE&G to meet its commitment to provide safe, proper and adequate electric service to consumers throughout New Jersey. Maintaining proper tree/vegetation clearance from the power lines is absolutely necessary to assure:

- The continued safety of homeowners living near the transmission lines.
- The safety of PSE&G employees and contractors working on the power lines.
- The reliability of the electric system.
- Compliance with Federal and State regulatory requirements.

Maintenance of the vegetation on/along the PSE&G rights-of-way located on your property is required at this time. This will include removal of any trees that have the ability to mature over 3 feet in height located in the wire zone (land located directly under the widest portion of the transmission line conductors). Vegetation in the wire zone will be managed to promote grasses and a low-growing plant community to obtain a meadow effect where possible. In the border zone (land from the edge of the transmission line wire zone to the outer boundary of the rights-of-way), where clearance permits, PSE&G may allow compatible vegetation, which will be determined on a case by case basis based on site specific conditions and specific species growth habit. Additionally, tree branches originating from outside the PSE&G transmission rights-of-way that hang over or cross onto the rights-of-way will be trimmed. The resulting debris from this activity, brush and wood, will be removed unless otherwise requested by the property owner prior to start of work. This work will be done by Asplundh Tree Expert LLC, a private contractor working for PSE&G, and will begin on or after **5/28/2021** and should be completed in approximately 45 days.
